#### What We Require:

- Strong communication and moderate research skills.
- Must conduct oneself in a mature/professional manner and be able to work accurately and efficiently with minimal supervision.
- Experience with computer skills and camera use is a plus.
- Proficient in Microsoft Suite Office and Photoshop Elements.
- Organized, with an ability to prioritize time-sensitive assignments.
- Familiarity with social networking sites desired, but we will also train.
- An interest in South Dakota history, Laura Ingalls Wilder and pioneer life.
- Interest in nonprofit management and community development.

**FQA:**

*Can I get academic credit for my internship?*

Yes, but it is your responsibility to arrange to receive credit with your university before arriving.

*How do I find housing?*

The museum will help locate housing.

*Do I need a vehicle?*

Yes, interns need to provide their own vehicle. Our tours go across town, so you will need to be able to drive.

*Wage:* \$9/hour with housing assistance

**Details:**

This is a full-time position and it begins May 15th and ends September 1st, but the dates are negotiable. This internship will be offered to an undergraduate or graduate student currently enrolled in a degree program at a two-to-four year institution or a recent graduate (no more than one year before the first day of the internship) in appropriate disciplines. Acceptable majors include, but are not limited to: museum studies, history, anthropology, tourism, communications, and non-profit management.
